It nurtures independent learning abilities, fosters inquiry, and recognizes the vital role of parents as co-educators in their children's development.

Homework Responsibilities:

Head of Department:

- Ensures that homework is an integral component of the curriculum, planned alongside other learning programs.
- Tailors homework to the students' age, abilities, and individual circumstances, considering special educational needs.
- Coordinates to ensure homework is manageable for students on a daily basis.

Teachers:

- Set and mark homework in alignment with the curriculum.
- Differentiate tasks and ensure they are well-structured.
- Communicate the purpose of homework clearly to students.
- Clarify how homework complements and extends classroom learning.

Students:

- Record homework tasks in diaries/planners/online postings, demonstrate understanding, and allocate sufficient time for completion.
- Submit completed work by the specified deadline.

Parents:

- Encourage and monitor homework, promptly informing the child's teacher if issues arise.
- Foster a conducive environment for homework completion.
- Express the importance of homework to their child, offering praise and encouragement.

Homework Plan by Grade:

Grades 1 and 2:

- · Homework should take approximately thirty minutes.
- Focus on reading program (10 minutes), with parents encouraged to assist.
- May include spelling practice and short written activities.
- Regular assignments in Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies to reinforce classroom learning.
- Daily reading/recitation of Qur'an (5-10 minutes).
- Daily reading of Arabic text (5-10 minutes).

Grades 3 and 4:

- Homework should take between thirty to forty-five minutes.
- Daily reading and spelling assignments.
- Additional literacy activities like preparing a written plan, class presentation, or book review.
- Memory tasks such as poetry or multiplication tables.
- Worksheets in various subjects to consolidate learning.

- Daily reading/recitation of Qur'an (5-10 minutes).
- Daily reading of Arabic text (5-10 minutes).

Grades 5 to 7:

- Homework should take between forty-five to ninety minutes.
- Subjects covered include Mathematics, Languages, Science, Arabic, Islamic Education, Life Skills, and ICT.
- Occasional extended assignments with guidelines and suggested completion times.
- Weekly research tasks to promote independent study.

Parental Involvement:

Interest and Support:

- Parents play a crucial role by showing interest in their child's homework.
- Checking homework diaries daily helps track assignments and due dates.
- Encourage prompt completion and engage in discussions about homework.
- Ensure assigned tasks are completed, and sign when required.

Setting Aside Time:

- Help your child allocate dedicated homework time.
- Provide a quiet, suitable environment for concentration.

Quality over Quantity:

- Emphasize that a minimum amount of time spent on homework results in better quality.
- Verify homework for accuracy and completion.

Express Value:

- Convey the importance of homework to your child.
- Praise and support your child's efforts.

Use of Reference Materials:

 Direct children to relevant reference materials like dictionaries, encyclopaedias, news articles, or documentaries for research and learning.

Internet Supervision:

- Supervise and assist children when they use the internet for homework.
- Ensure online searches are focused on relevant information.

Checking Homework:

- Review your child's work, offering guidance but not answers.
- Ask questions to help them find solutions independently.

Communication:

- Discussing homework with your child demonstrates its significance.
- Identifying problem areas helps improve learning.

Recording Homework:

- Regularly check your child's homework diary.
- Sign when necessary to maintain effective communication with the school.

Problem Resolution:

• If homework consumes excessive time or poses difficulties in planning, encourage your child to discuss this with their facilitator or subject teacher.
