## Students are required to swipe their RFID cards in the morning on the machines available at the entrance to register their attendance.

#### **Punctuality Procedures:**

It is important for your child to contribute to improving attendance at the school, as it is one of ourtargets.


- Students must be present in school by 7:50am before the assembly starts.
- It is mandatory for students to present on 1<sup>st</sup> and last day of the school.
- No student is allowed to leave the premises early without special permission.
- In all cases of absence, the parents are expected to make an entry in the absence record section of student organizer, if not exceeding 2 days.
- If more than 2 days, a medical note must be attached with the diary note.
- Students with absence of more than a month, without any information, are liable to have their names struck off the school rolls.
- The child MUST NOT be sent to school in case of high fever, rashes or any suspected chronic disease, unless fully recovered.
- A minimum of 75% attendance is MANDATORY for promotion to next class.

## The School Curriculum

#### **CURRICULUM IMPLEMENTATION**

#### **Curriculum Philosophy**

The school curriculum is of paramount importance in the field of education for several reasons. It serves as the backbone of the educational system and plays a crucial role in shaping students' learning experiences, knowledge, and skills. The school curriculum is an essential component of the education system. It guides what is taught, how it is taught, and how students' progress is measured. A well-designed curriculum is a fundamental factor in providing students with a high-quality education and preparing them for success in an ever-changing world.

#### EARLY YEARS CURRICULUM

#### KG1 & KG2

Early years curriculum for children in Kindergarten 1 (KG1) and Kindergarten 2 (KG2) is designed to provide a holistic and developmentally appropriate educational experience for young learners. The primary focus is on fostering their social, emotional, physical, and cognitive development. The curriculum in these early years is often playbased and encourages exploration, curiosity, and creativity. Some key components and aspects of the early years curriculum for KG1 and KG2:

1. Play-Based Learning: Play is at the heart of the early years curriculum. Play-based activities and experiences are used to promote social interaction, problem-solving, and the development of fine and gross motor skills.

2. Social and Emotional Development: The curriculum emphasizes the development of social and emotional skills, such as self-regulation, empathy, and effective communication. Young children learn to interact with their peers and teachers, express their feelings, and develop a sense of self.

3. Language and Communication: Language development is a key focus, and children are exposed to rich oral language experiences. Storytelling, rhymes, and songs are commonly used to enhance language skills.

4. Literacy: Early literacy skills are introduced gradually. This includes recognizing letters and their sounds, basic sight words, and the beginning stages of reading readiness.

5. Numeracy: Basic numeracy skills, such as counting, number recognition, and simple math concepts (e.g., addition and subtraction within small numbers), are introduced.

6. Science and Nature Exploration: Young children are encouraged to explore and observe the natural world through hands-on activities. They might engage in simple experiments and discover basic scientific concepts.

7. Art and Creativity: Art, music, and creative expression are integral to the curriculum. Children have opportunities to paint, draw, sing, dance, and explore their creativity in various ways.

8. Physical Development: Gross and fine motor skills are developed through activities like running, jumping, climbing, and using manipulative materials like building blocks and puzzles.

9. Social Studies: Even at this early stage, children are introduced to basic concepts related to the world around them. They might learn about their own community, families, and cultures.

10. Health and Wellbeing: Basic health and hygiene habits are introduced, including proper handwashing, personal cleanliness, and healthy eating.

11. Play and Socialization: Children learn how to engage in cooperative play, share, take turns, and develop social skills. These skills are essential for building positive relationships.

12. Assessment: Assessment in KG1 and KG2 is often formative and observational. Teachers observe children's progress, take notes, and use these observations to adjust their teaching strategies and provide targeted support.

13. Parental Involvement: Parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's learning journey. They may receive regular updates, participate in school events, and support learning at home.

14. Inclusivity: The curriculum aims to be inclusive and adaptable to meet the diverse needs of students, including those with varying abilities and backgrounds.

The overarching goal of KG1 and KG2 curriculum is to create a nurturing, stimulating, and safe environment where young children can explore, learn, and develop a strong foundation for future education.

**Arabic Language:** Students in the early years are introduced to the Arabic language and verbal lessons delivered by Arabic specialists take place from KG2.

By the end of the KG2, children will be confident and comfortable in the school environment and have basic knowledge of core concepts in order to prepare them to begin the CBSE Curriculum.

#### THE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) curriculum for the primary stage typically covers classes I to V. The CBSE curriculum for primary education is designed to provide a strong foundation in core subjects while fostering the holistic development of students. The primary stage curriculum serves as the foundation for further education and aims to provide students with a strong academic background, critical thinking skills, and a sense of moral and social responsibility. It aligns with national educational goals and standards and is periodically updated to reflect contemporary educational best practices and emerging needs.

The curriculum for **Grade 1 and Grade 2** aims to provide a strong foundation in core subjects while fostering the holistic development of students. It aims to provide students with a strong academic background, critical thinking skills, and a sense of moral and social responsibility. The curriculum aligns with national educational goals and standards and is periodically updated to reflect contemporary educational best practices and emerging needs.

The school focuses on providing a well-rounded and developmentally appropriate education to young learners. The educators aim to build a strong foundation in core subjects, foster holistic development, and introduce students to key concepts and skills.

The curriculum for Grade 3 to Grade 5 builds upon the foundation established in earlier grades and continues to provide a comprehensive and well-rounded education. It focuses on the development of critical thinking skills, a deeper understanding of subjects, and the introduction of more complex concepts. The Grade 3 to Grade 5 serves as a crucial stepping stone for students as they prepare for more advanced education. It aims to equip students with a strong academic foundation, critical thinking skills, and values necessary for their personal and academic growth. The curriculum aligns with national educational goals and standards and is periodically updated to reflect contemporary educational best practices and evolving needs.

The focus of our curriculum is based on rational of students being able to relate all learning to Real-Life and for Student Involvement in their learning. Through the integration of technology, students are given a myriad of learning opportunities to develop their 'skills', which include the ability to apply knowledge, think creatively and problemsolve; the ability to express oneself articulately; the ability to persevere and develop selfconfidence; the ability to collaborate with others, and the ability to learn. We aim to improve our students' critical, creative, rigorous thinking to develop higher order thinking skills, improve communication skills and help children learn to co- operate with others.

Within the Primary, we aim to foster the holistic development of students. It encompasses not only academic subjects but also physical, social, emotional, and moral development. Play activities promote cognitive, social, and emotional development.

A strong focus on language development helps students develop effective communication skills, literacy, and the ability to express them.

The Primary stage incorporates co-curricular activities such as art, music, physical education, and value-based education to promote creativity, physical fitness, and character development. The Primary School is the stage of enhanced learning, where the students are constantly evolving and growing, intellectually and emotionally.

Students prepare for the UAE International Benchmark assessments as prescribed by the KHDA, which include CAT4 (selected year groups), GL-Progress Tests, NGRT (3 times a year).

## **School ID Policy**

#### **General Guidelines for School Parents**

#### 1. Signing in with Security Staff

All Parents/Visitors who intend to access the school premises must have to pass through the security post at the main entrance to provide purpose of his visit and to complete the signing in process.

- Tell him/her who you are
- Tell him/her why you are there
- Show your identification
- Who you are visiting
- Sign the visitor's book (if needed)
- Comply with all necessary requirements for access to a school as informed by the security staff
- Deposit any of the following original valid IDs: (not required if Emirates ID card reader is available at each premises) Driving license, Emirates ID card (UAE only), Labour card or Any other ID issued by the Government

#### 2. Student I.D Cards

- In order to ensure identification and safeguarding, all students must carry and wear the student **D** cards to gain access to the school premise.
- Student have to swipe the ID at the biometric meter to register their clock-in the premises.
- Comply with all necessary requirements for access to a school as informed by the security staff.
- It is expected from students to wear and display your ID at all times.
