

Policy for Late Coming Students

Introduction:

Procedure:

1. School Timings and Bell:

7. Parent Notification:

If a student continues to arrive late for more than three days, the Principal will take further action.

- A written letter will be mailed to the parents by the Principal, emphasizing the importance of punctuality.
- The student may be marked as absent for the day or suspended from school for one day.
