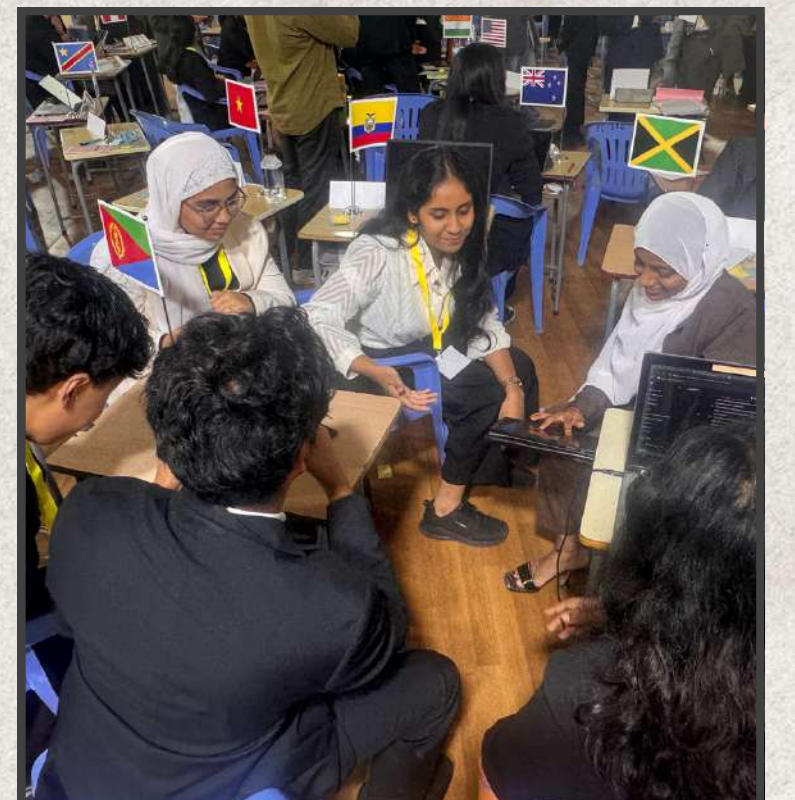
It wasn't just a committee session... it was a full MUN experience.

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Draft Resolution

From Debate to Draft **SHAPING** **AI'S FUTURE**



DEBATE, AMEND, DECIDE: AI'S GLOBAL BLUEPRINT



After debates on AI's role in nations, the hall turned to the Draft Resolution. Divided into three blocks, delegates outlined priorities — sustainable frameworks, ethical use, and societal benefit.

Some blocks proposed amendments, refining clauses for accountability, transparency, and global cooperation. North Korea and Russia emphasized humanity and inclusivity, while Japan and China addressed innovation under scrutiny from other delegates.

UAE and Saudi Arabia highlighted misinformation, SDG goals, equality, and economic growth. France and Qatar debated governance clauses, with Northernway's amendment passing amid a heated ethical AI discussion with the USA. The Draft Resolution had become a blueprint for responsible, fair, and global AI governance.
